You wrap our most vulnerable neighbors in God's loving embrace as your support helps Open Door Mission provide safe shelter and nutritious meals, teach skills to build brighter futures, lift up our guests and ministry in prayer, and rejoice over every heart restored and life rebuilt!



Life is challenging right now. As inflation continues, costs for

necessities like housing, gas, utilities, and groceries are higher than ever. These rising costs affect us all, but it's even harder for our struggling neighbors to make ends meet. Open Door Mission is not immune from these challenges either. We are now experiencing a 67% increase in food costs as well as a staggering 79% increase in fuel costs. Food donations are down 10% in comparison to this time last year.

Through it all, I remain faithful to God's calling and grateful that I can rely on friends like you.

My prayer is that you will do the same. I hope you will take comfort in the love of friends and family, and the joy of knowing hearts are changed for eternity thanks to you.

Financial Principles

Open Door Mission belongs to God and the staff is committed to Him. The Mission is governed by a Godly and compassionate board of directors that understands its responsibility to assure your contributions are used honorably.

We are an arm of the Heartland's church community. Through their support, many churches have commissioned ODM to reach out to the poor, the homeless and the defeated.

- We never attempt to raise more money than we need.
- We will pay for our purchases immediately or within 30 days.
- We believe Christians should support their local church first. We will never encourage believers to support the Mission until they have first met their obligations to their churches.

- We believe each gift comes from people who give sacrificially. We will use all gifts prayerfully and conservatively. No one will become financially wealthy as a result of their efforts at ODM. All donations will be used for the purposes they are given.
- We will never sell or rent our donor mailing list.
- We will promptly send receipts for all monetary donations.
- We believe our supporters want to hear from us in times of plenty and in times of difficulty. We pledge to act with integrity when raising funds. We will always communicate ODM's needs honestly.
- We will conform to the standards of the ECFA, submitting to an independent audit each year and maintaining an "open book" policy.

Safe Shelter

Raised in South Dakota, life for Ty was difficult from the start. At the age of 4, both of Ty's parents were in prison, and he spent most of his childhood living in motels with his grandmother. Eventually, he began drinking at 14 years old, and this habit would continue on even throughout his college years.

Ty's addiction would eventually lead to destruction throughout his life. He lost his housing, his job, and his vehicle, but most importantly Ty's drinking damaged valuable relationships with those he cared about most. When both his grandma and dad passed away within a short time, Ty felt like he was at rock bottom.

"This was my lowest point in my life," said Ty. "After they passed away, I ended up getting arrested for a drinkingrelated offense and spent some time in jail."

After being released from jail, Ty heard about Open Door Mission and the New Life Recovery program. "God put



it on my heart and mind to keep pushing forward," said Ty. "Since first entering the program, Christ has given me a new beginning." With this new beginning, Ty has experienced lasting change through the New Life Recovery program. He now has structure in his life, sobriety, and an ambition to succeed. Today, Ty works full time at Open Door Mission's Men's Center while furthering his education in human services.

Ty and many others like him have found safe, warm shelter and protection from the elements at Open Door Mission. As we approach the coldest months of the year, the basic needs of safe shelter and a warm bed could mean the difference between life and death for many experiencing homelessness in the Omaha Metro.

Feeding the Hungry

Growing up in a small town, addiction was common among Cristen's community as a child. As her parents and surrounding family members struggled with drugs and alcohol, it wasn't long until Cristen continued down a similar path. For years, she knew nothing other than the cycle of abuse and addiction.

As addiction progressed and she struggled with opioid addiction, Cristen felt helpless with no way out of the lifestyle she found herself in. Things only began to change after she witnessed several of her own family members be transformed out of the cycle of addiction. "I knew them. I've seen them as addicts and after coming to the Open Door Mission they were completely changed." While her family members found new life at the Open Door Mission, Cristen's heart was stirred, and her eyes were opened to the way out she had been looking for.

"Seeing that change is what brought me to the Open Door Mission because I wanted that in my life."

Since arriving in November, Cristen found sobriety, stability, and peace through the New Life Recovery Program and graduated the program in April 2022! Throughout her growth, she has learned to forgive, to set boundaries, and to live a life free from addiction. Cristen has made amends with her loved ones, and is creating a better life for her and her children by continuing her education. Today, Cristen works full time at Open Door Mission's Lydia House.



Every day, individuals and families like Cristen's don't know where their next meal will come from. At Open Door Mission, HOPE begins with a meal. Meeting the basic needs of the hungry and hurting opens the door to empower individuals and families to create lasting change.

Homeless Prevention

Every day, Open Door Mission opens the doors of our Omaha and Council Bluffs Family Outreach Centers to meet the rapidly growing needs of our community. Once a month, individuals and families can access consumer choice food pantries, household goods, and personal items including toiletries and diapers at absolutely no cost. Holiday assistance programs are offered at Thanksgiving and Christmas.



YOUR DONATIONS AT WORK

In January-September 2022, Open Door Mission:

- Provided 21,437 individuals representing 6,473 unique families with homeless prevention services, empowering them to remain in their own homes.
- Provided a total service count of 124,065 despite the Timberlake Outreach Center being under renovations for nearly 3 months!
- Processed and redistributed 3.78 million pounds of Gift-in-Kind donations from generous donors.

X Campus Improvements

Recently, the Timberlake Outreach Center underwent a \$400,000 renovation project to improve the experience of those receiving services and greatly increase the efficiency of our operations. These renovations included the addition of an indoor waiting area, automatic sliding doors, a furniture loading area, LED lighting and much more. On just the first day after reopening, Open Door Mission provided homeless prevention resources to 248 unique households!



Open Door Mission has also recently expanded our storage facilities to keep up with the increasing needs of our community. This includes a newly renovated warehouse with the capacity to store more than 700 gaylords of donated goods as well as a cold-storage area that holds up to 40 pallets of frozen goods and 20 pallets of cooler items. This one million dollar project wouldn't be possible without the generous and compassionate support of partners like you. Thank you for joining Open Door Mission as we continue to change the lives of those who are hungry and hurting in our community.

Life Changing Programs

Gary's journey to the Open Door Mission began after he lost everything to alcoholism. While living in homelessness, he was met on a park bench by an Open Door Mission friend. Defensive and uneasy, Gary kept his guard up. Eventually when this employee offered to pray for him, Gary's heart was softened and his life would soon change.

After arriving at the Open Door Mission, Gary was still unsure of what to expect. Feeling scared and hungover, his first instinct was to run away until former Men's Director Pat McKernan offered to bring him into his office and interview Gary on the spot. Now Gary works in that very office where it all began. "I can't thank God enough for all the blessings He's bestowed on my life. Pat always said stay for the blessings and that's exactly what I did."

In January-September 2022, Open Door Mission:

- Celebrated 72 graduates from life-changing programs.
- Served an average of 55 men and women every month in our Learning Centers, offering GED preparation and testing, career readiness training, and life skills.



• Tutored an average of 17 children every month to further their education.

Children and Youth

Without a roof over their head, children experiencing homelessness are more likely to become sick, suffer abuse or neglect, and food insecurity. Without structure and stability, they often face compounding issues of severe trauma, developmental roadblocks, and educational disruptions.

Open Door Mission addresses the unique traumas and special needs of children living in homelessness and poverty. In addition to basic needs, Open Door Mission's children and youth services focus on educational support, nutrition and health, and behavioral and emotional counseling year-round.

Open Door Mission has provided 89 children with local Boys and Girls Club Annual Memberships.

In January-September 2022, Open Door Mission:

- Provided a free, therapeutic, and structured summer day camp for children to learn, grow, and have fun!
- Provided 588 total camp days this summer.
- Hosted Animal and Art therapy sessions to meet the unique needs of children experiencing homelessness and poverty.

In July, the Health and Wellness Clinic received a Gold Rating from the NAFC Quality Standards program, recognizing the consistent standard of care provided to patients on Open Door Mission's campus. Thank you for joining us in our commitment to quality care as Open Door Mission continues to meet the needs of those experiencing homelessness and poverty.
